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Introduction / Getting started

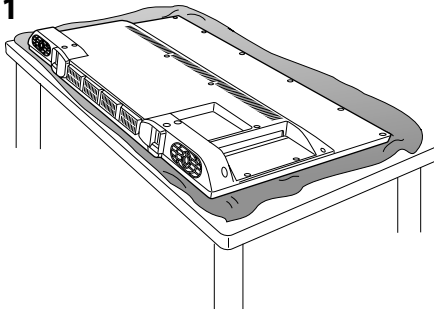
Pedestal stand Assembling

CAUTION: Before beginning pedestal assembly, carefully lay the front of the LCD Panel face down on a flat, cushioned surface such as a quilt or blanket. Leave the bottom of the unit protruding over the edge of the surface and assemble as indicated.

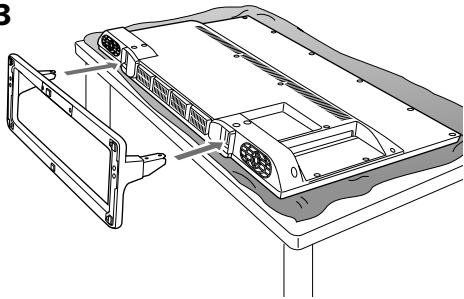
NOTE:

Extreme care should always be used when attaching the pedestal stand to avoid damage to the LCD panel.

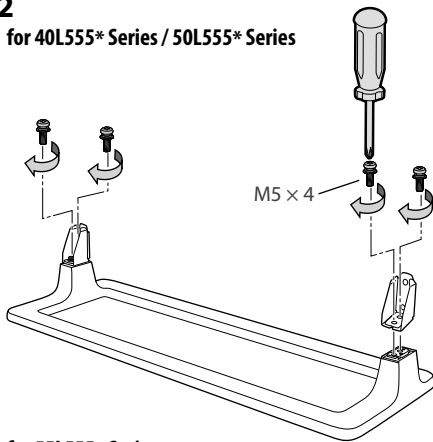


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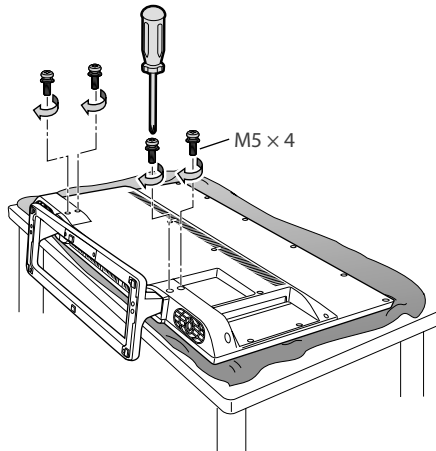


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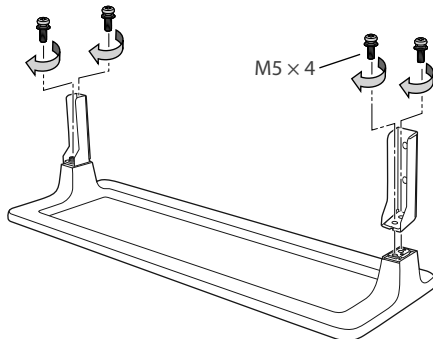

Warning: Ensure the power cable is not pinched when attaching the pedestal stand as this could cause an electric shock.

Important Safety Instructions

Be sure to observe the following instructions and precautions to ensure safe use of this TV.

Installation

1) WARNING: To prevent injury, this apparatus must be securely attached to a stable surface/wall in accordance with the installation instructions.

Install the TV in a horizontal, stable location. Attach the TV to the stand with the mounting screw.

- If the TV is not installed securely, it may lean or fall over and cause an injury.
- To prevent injury, use the exclusive optional stand or wall-hanging bracket to install this TV on a stable surface or wall securely in accordance with a qualified technician.

2) Never place the TV in an unstabilized location such as on a shaky table, incline or location subject to vibration.

- Only use cabinets or stands recommended by the TV manufacturer.
- Only use furniture that can safely support the TV.
- Ensure that the TV is not hanging over the edge of the supporting furniture.
- Never place the TV on tall furniture (for example, cupboards or bookcases) without anchoring both the furniture and the TV to a suitable support.
- Never stand the TV on cloth or other material placed between the TV and supporting furniture.

The TV may drop or fall off, which may cause an injury or damage.

3) Never stand or climb on the TV.

- Educate children about the dangers of climbing on furniture to reach the TV or its controls.

Be especially careful in households with children to prevent them through climbing on top of the TV. It may move, fall over, break, become damaged or cause an injury.

4) Always connect the power plug to an appropriate electrical outlet equipped with 110-240V AC, 50/60Hz.

Never use the TV outside the specified voltage range. It may cause a fire or an electric shock.

About the fuse

In a three pin earthing-type, the fuse fitted in this plug is approved by ASTA or BSI to BS1362. It should only be replaced by a correctly rated and approved type and the fuse cover must be refitted.

About the use

- Make sure to insert the plugs firmly, when plugging the AC power cord into the TV set end and wall outlet end.
- Make sure to hold the plug, when unplugging the AC power cord.
- Never use other cord except for supplied AC power cord, and never use the supplied power cord for any other purpose.

5) Never insert or remove the power plug with wet hands.

This may cause an electric shock.

6) Never block or cover the slots and openings in the cabinet.

- Never place the TV so that it is facing upward or on its side.
- Never place the TV in a closet, bookcase or other similar area where the ventilation is poor.
- Never drape a newspaper, tablecloth or curtain on the TV.
- When installing the TV against a wall, always keep the TV at least 10 cm away from the wall.
- Never place the TV on a soft unstable surface, such as a carpet, or a cushion.

The inside of this TV will overheat if the ventilation holes are covered, blocked or sealed, which may result in a fire.

7) Never place the TV near a heater or in direct sunlight.

The surface of the cabinet or power cord may melt and result in a fire or an electric shock.

8) Never place the TV in an area exposed to high humidity levels, such as in a bathroom or close to a humidifier.

This may cause a fire or an electric shock.

9) Never place the TV next to a stove where it will be exposed to oil, smoke, or steam, or in a location where there is a large quantity of dust.

This may cause a fire or an electric shock.

10) Precautions for moving the TV

- When moving the TV, be sure to remove the plug from the wall outlet and disconnect the aerial cable and audio/video cables, any steady ties and mounting screw. A fire or an electric shock may result if the power cord is damaged.
- When carrying the TV, at least two people are needed. Be sure to carry it upright.
- Never carry the TV with the screen facing up or down.

11) Precautions for installing on outdoor aerial

An outside aerial system should not be located in the vicinity of overhead power lines, or other electric light or power circuits.

If the aerial falls down or drops, it may cause an injury or an electric shock.

Use

1) Never place hot objects or open flame sources, such as lighted candles or nightlights, on or close to the TV.

High temperatures can melt plastic and lead to fires.

2) The apparatus shall not be exposed to dripping or splashing and that no objects filled with liquids, such as vases, shall be placed on the apparatus.

When liquids are spilled or small items are dropped inside the TV, this may cause a fire or an electric shock.

If small objects drop inside the TV, turn off the TV and remove the power plug from the outlet immediately and contact a service technician.

3) Never insert objects (metal or paper) or pour water inside the TV through ventilation holes and other openings.

These items may cause a fire or an electric shock. If these objects are inserted inside the TV, turn off the TV and remove the power plug from the outlet immediately and contact a service technician. Be especially careful that children do not insert objects in the TV.

4) When the TV will not be used for a long period of time, such as during vacation or travel, remove the power plug from the wall outlet for safety.

- The TV is not completely disconnected from the power supply line, as minute current is consumed even when the O/I Power switch is turned off.
- The Mains plug or an appliance coupler is used as the disconnect device, therefore the disconnect device shall remain readily operable.

5) Never pull on the power cord when removing the plug from the wall outlet.

Always hold the plug firmly when removing it. If the power cord is yanked, the cord may become damaged and a fire or an electric shock may occur.

6) Never cut, break, modify, twist, bunch up or bent the cord or apply excessive force or tension to it.

Never place heavy objects on the cord or allow it to overheat as this may cause damage, a fire or an electric shock. Contact a service technician if the power cord is damaged.

7) If there is thunder or lightning, never touch the aerial cable or other connected cables.

You may suffer an electric shock.

8) Turn off the TV before unplugging the power cord.

Failure to do so may cause a malfunction.

Service

1) Never repair, modify or disassemble the TV by yourself.

It may cause a fire or an electric shock. Consult a service technician for inspection and repairs.

2) When a malfunction occurs, or if smoke or an unusual odor comes from the TV, turn off the TV and remove the power plug from the outlet immediately.

Make sure that the smoke or smell has stopped, then contact a service technician. If the TV is still used in this condition, it may cause a fire or an electric shock.

3) If the TV is dropped or the cabinet is broken, turn off the TV and remove the power plug from the outlet immediately.

If the TV has power in this condition, it may cause a fire or an electric shock. If the cabinet is broken, be careful when handling the TV to prevent an injury.

Contact a service technician for inspection and repair.

4) When the TV reaches the end of its useful life, ask a qualified service technician to properly dispose of the TV.

Cleaning

CAUTION: Avoid using chemicals (such as air refreshers, cleaning agents, etc.) on or near the TV pedestal. Studies indicate that plastics may weaken and crack over time from the combination effects of chemical agents and mechanical stress (such as weight of TV). Failure to follow these instructions could result in serious injury and/or permanent damage to TV and TV pedestal.

1) Remove the power plug before cleaning.

Never use solvents such as benzine or thinner to clean the TV.

- These solvents may distort the cabinet or damage its finish.
- If rubber or vinyl products remain in contact with the TV for a long time, a stain may result. If the cabinet becomes dirty, clean it with a soft, dry cloth.

When cleaning the surface of the LCD display, wipe the panel surface gently with a soft, dry cloth.

2) Periodically disconnect the power plug from the outlet and check it.

If dust has collected on the power plug connectors, clean off the dust with a dry cloth.

This dust may cause a fire due to reduced insulation on the plug.

Important information

1) About LCD screen

- If you have the LCD screen facing to the sun, the LCD screen will be damaged. Be aware of locating the TV close to a window or outdoors.
- Never press the LCD screen strongly or scratch it, and never put anything on it. These actions will damage the LCD screen.

2) About cabinet and LCD screen

Never spray volatile compounds such as insecticide on the cabinet and LCD screen. This may cause a discolouration or damage the cabinet and LCD screen.

3) About afterimage

If a still picture is displayed, an afterimage may remain on the screen, however it will disappear. This is not a sign of malfunction.

4) Some pixels of the screen do not light up

The LCD display panel is manufactured using an extremely high level of precision technology, however sometimes some pixels of the screen may be missing picture elements or have luminous spots. This is not sign of malfunction.

5) About Interference

The LCD display may cause interference in image, sound, etc. of other electronic equipment that receives electromagnetic waves (e.g. AM radios and video equipment).

6) About using under the low temperature places

If you use the TV in the room of 0°C or less, the picture brightness may vary until the LCD monitor warms up. This is not a sign of malfunction.

7) When disposing of or transferring ownership of the TV

Before disposing of or transferring ownership of the TV, perform "Resetting the TV" (see page 34).

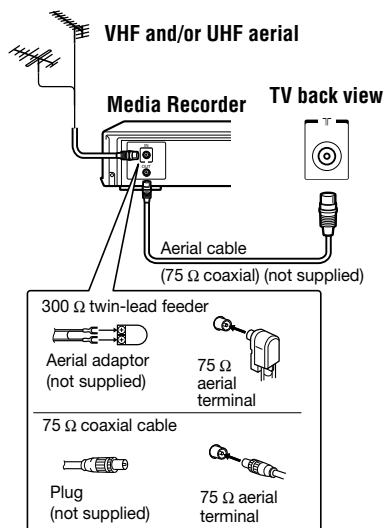
Connecting an aerial

Optimum reception of colour requires a good signal and will generally mean that an outdoor aerial must be used.

The exact type and positioning of the aerial will depend upon your particular area.

Your TOSHIBA dealer or service personnel can best advise you on which aerial to use in your area.

Before connecting the aerial cable, turn off all main power switches.



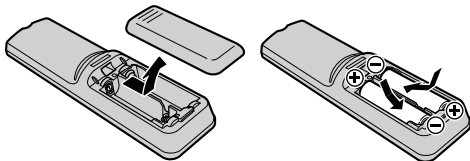
Exploring your new TV

Installing the remote control batteries

Easy remote control

Remove the battery cover.

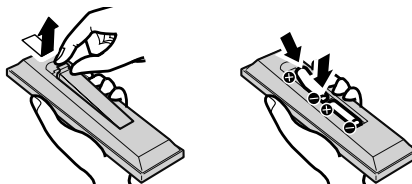
Insert two LR6 (AA) batteries matching the -/+ polarities of the battery to the -/+ marks inside the battery compartment.



TV remote control

Remove the battery cover.

Insert two R03 (AAA) batteries matching the -/+ polarities of the battery to the -/+ marks inside the battery compartment.



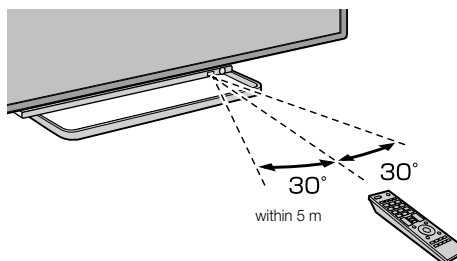
Cautions:

- Dispose of batteries in a designated disposal area. Batteries must not be exposed to excessive heat such as sunshine, fire or the like.
- Attention should be drawn to the environmental aspects of battery disposal.
- Never mix battery types or combine used batteries with new ones.

NOTE:

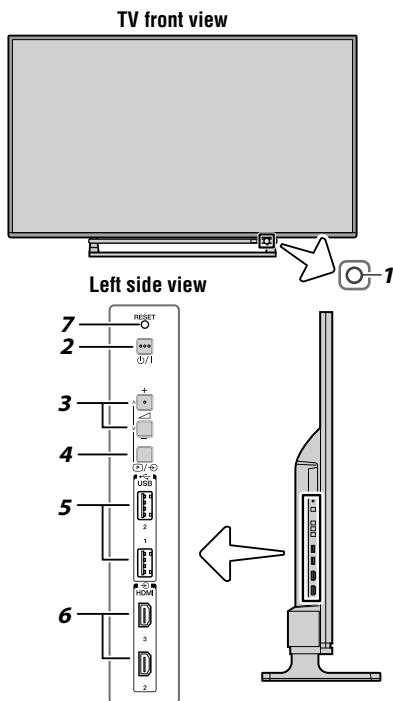
- If the remote control does not operate correctly, or if the operating range becomes reduced, replace both batteries with new ones.
- If the batteries are dead or if you will not use the remote control for a long time, remove the batteries to prevent battery acid from leaking into the battery compartment.

TV panel controls

- You can operate your TV using the buttons on the side panel or the remote control. The back of the panel provide the terminal connections to connect other equipment to your TV (pages 37–41).
- For the use of each control, see the pages in brackets.

- 1** **⏻/I (power LED)** — Power indicator (page 13).
- 2** **⏻/I (power on/standby)** — Press to turn the TV on/ standby (page 13).
- 3** **◀ + (volume)** — These buttons adjust the volume level.
^ v (mode up/down) — These buttons select programme position or input source.
- 4** **⏻/⏪ (programme position or input source)** — When external input list is displayed, an input source can be selected.
- 5** **USB 1-2 (input terminals)** — Insert your USB storage device (photo, video and music) (page 52).
 - Connect a USB HDD to the USB 1 port if it needs power supply.

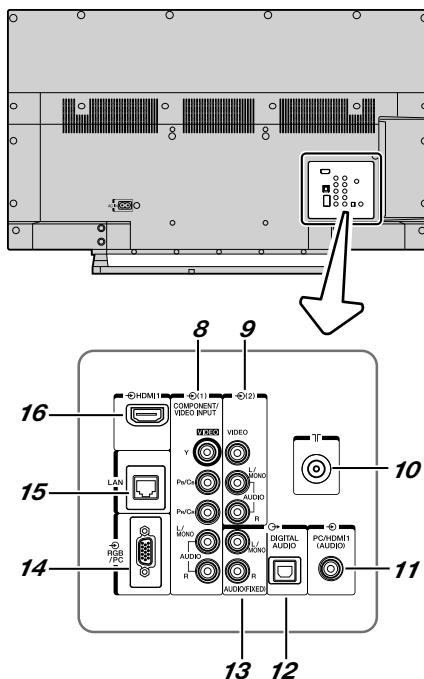
- You can connect a keyboard or mouse to the USB port.
- If you are using a wireless mouse only, you cannot enter text. Use also a keyboard.

NOTE:

Do not connect a USB device when the TV is performing operations other than reception (setup, software update, etc.).

- 6** **HDMI 2 - 3 (input terminals)** — High-Definition Multimedia Interface input receives digital audio and uncompressed digital video from an HDMI device (page 37).
- 7** **RESET** — Press this button with a fine-pointed object to reboot forcibly.

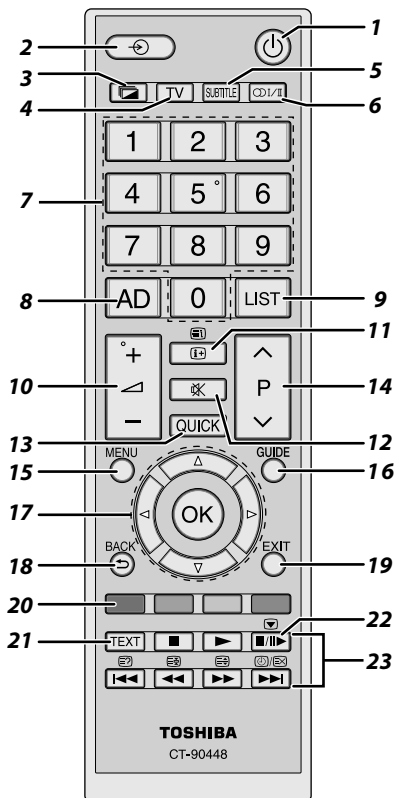
Sample Illustration: 40L555* Series front and side panel controls and connection

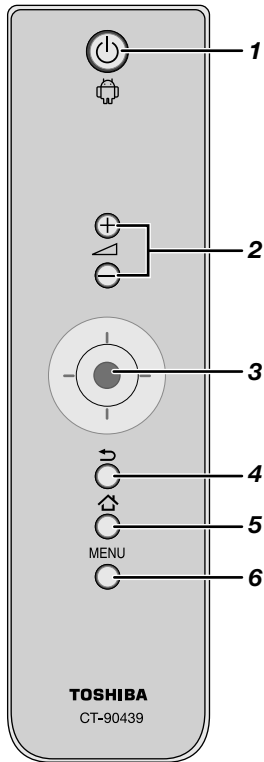

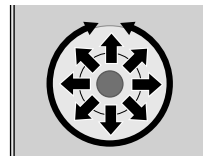

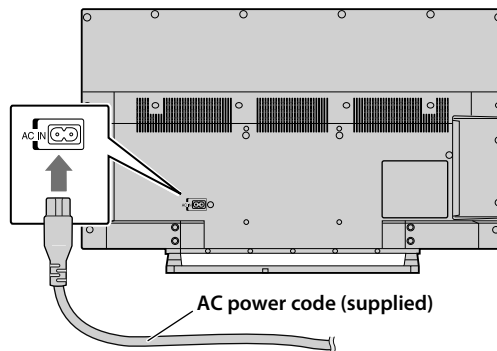

Connecting the AC power cord to your TV (for 40L555* Series / 50L555* Series)

- 1 Push the AC power cord plug firmly into the AC IN connector on the back of the TV.



Tuning the TV for the first time

Before switching on the TV, put your decoder and media recorder to standby, if they are connected, and ensure that the aerial is connected.

- To set up the network simultaneously, refer to "To connect the TV to a home network - Wired" (page 46) or "To connect the TV to a network Wireless" (page 46) beforehand to prepare the TV.

1 Press the **⏻** button on the TV remote control.

The **Welcome** screen will appear. This screen will appear the first time that the TV is switched on.

Use the **Easy remote control** in steps 2 and 3.

NOTE:

Certain expressions used in the GUI of this product may not correspond to the TV (e.g., touch/phone/tablet).

2 Select a language, and press the pointing key.

3 Select **Start**, and press the pointing key.

Hereinafter follow the on-screen instructions to continue setting up.

Set up the wireless LAN	Configure the wireless LAN settings. You can skip this step and configure the settings later. (page 47)
Set up Google™	If you do not have a Google account, a screen appears prompting you to register an account.
Confirm the Google positioning	Read the on-screen explanation. If you will not use the function or allow access, uncheck the box.
Confirm the time zone, date and time	Select and change the items if necessary.
Set the owner	Select ▶ to skip this step. Set this later on if necessary.

When the Android setup is complete, the **Country** setup screen appears.

Proceed to the TV initial setup.

NOTE:

If you press the **⏻** button on the Easy remote control to start the operation, the Home screen appears and the setup ends.

To set up the TV Application next, select the **TV** icon on the screen, and press the pointing key to start the TV.

Use the **TV remote control** from Step 4 onwards.

4 Press **▽**, **△**, **◀** or **▶** to select the country and press **OK**.

- When the message screen is displayed, select **Next** and press **OK**.
- If you select **Indonesia**, the **Postal Code** input screen is displayed. Use the **Number** buttons to enter your postal code, select **Next**, and then press **OK**.

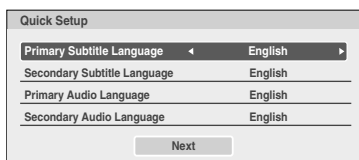

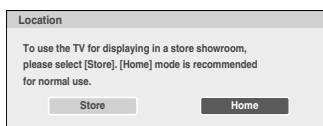

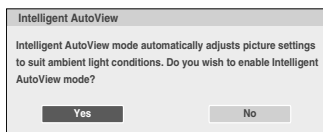
- 6** Select **Next** and press **OK** to display the **Location** menu. Press \triangleleft or \triangleright to select **Store** or **Home**. You can select either **Home** or **Store** mode. **Home** is recommended for normal home use. Select **Store** when using a TV for displaying in a shop, etc.

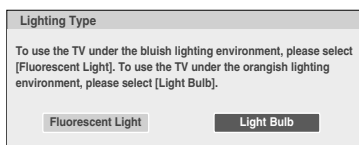

- **Intelligent AutoView** menu is not available.

- 7** Press **OK** to display the **Intelligent AutoView** menu (page 21). Press \triangleleft or \triangleright to select **Yes** or **No**.

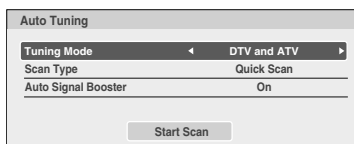


- When you select **No**, skip to step 9.

- 8** Press **OK** to display the **Lighting Type** menu. Press \triangleleft or \triangleright to select **Fluorescent Light** or **Light Bulb**.
- Set the ambient light environment to help **Intelligent Auto View** function more effectively (page 21).



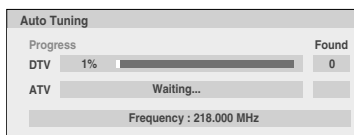
- 9** Press **OK** to display the **Auto Tuning** setup menu.



- 10** Select **Start Scan** and press **OK** to start the automatic search.

The television will start to search for available **DTV** and/or **ATV** channels. The progress bar will indicate the scan status.

You must allow the television to complete the search.



When the search is complete, the search result is displayed.

The **Auto Tuning** screen will display the total number of services found.

- 11** Press \triangleleft or \triangleright to view the **DTV** (digital channel) or **ATV** (analogue channel) lists.

- 12** Press ∇ or \triangle to move through the list to select a channel and press **OK** to view.

In **ATV** mode, some areas may receive duplicate stations. There may not be a clear picture or the signal may be weak, so the station order can be changed using **ATV Manual Tuning**.

Remember:

Press **TV** at any time to select between **ATV** and **DTV** modes.

NOTE:

The time will be set automatically by transmission but can be advanced or decreased by using **Local Time Setting** in the **DTV Settings** screen.

NOTE:

The **Quick Setup** menu can also be displayed from the **SETUP** menu at any time while watching TV broadcasts.

Basic Operations

You can enjoy visual or audio content, applications, and TV broadcasts (or external input) by starting TV Application.

Turning the TV on

Switching on the TV

Connect the power cord to a wall outlet, the O/I power indicator lights in red (standby mode).

Using the TV remote control

- 1 Press O/I on the TV remote control, the O/I power indicator lights in green.

The TV Application starts up, and the TV broadcast (or external input) appears.

NOTE:

If you watch black and white programmes when the **Colour System** mode is set to "PAL" (factory set), colour noise may appear on the screen. In this case select the appropriate **Colour System** (For the system of each country or region, refer to pages 17, 67).

Using the Easy remote control

- 1 Press O/I on the Easy remote control, and the O/I power indicator lights up in green.
 - When **Quick Start** (page 50) is set to **Off**, the TOSHIBA logo will be displayed, followed by the home screen.

Using the TV itself

- 1 Press O/I on the TV left side panel, and the O/I power indicator lights up in green.

The previously displayed screen appears.

Switching off the TV

- 1 Press O/I on the remote control or O/I on the TV left side panel to switch to the standby mode.

NOTE:

- When the TV will not be used for a long period of time, such as during vacation or travel, remove the power plug from the wall outlet.
- The TV will automatically turn off in 15 minutes based on **No Signal Power Down** settings (page 28) if no signal is detected. The TV will automatically turn itself off after approximately 2 hours if you do not operate the TV after turned on by on timer function.
- If power is cut off while you are viewing the TV, the Last Mode Memory function turns on the TV automatically when power is applied again. If power is going to be off for a long time and you are going to be away from your TV, unplug the power cord to prevent the TV from turning on in your absence.

Displaying the home screen

If you press O/I on the Easy remote control while viewing the TV broadcast (or external input), the home screen appears.

- For operations on the home screen, refer to page 42.

Watching the TV

To start the TV Application and switch to the TV broadcast (or external input) while on the home screen, perform either of the following:

- Select the O/I and confirm.



- The actual screen may differ in appearance.

NOTE

If **BACK** on the TV remote control is pressed twice, the TV Application closes.

Using the TV's features

Use the TV remote control while watching TV broadcasts (or external input).

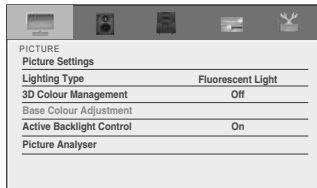

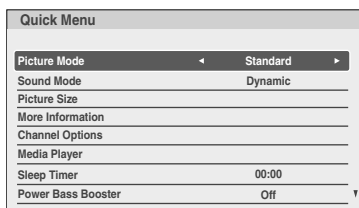


NOTE:

- In the video input mode (VIDEO, HDMI and PC), **Country, Auto Tuning, ATV Manual Tuning, DTV Manual Tuning and Quick Setup** are not available.
- If you do not make a selection for a while, the menu display disappears automatically.
- If you want to close the menu display instantly, press **EXIT** or **MENU**.
- To return to the previous menu, press **BACK**.

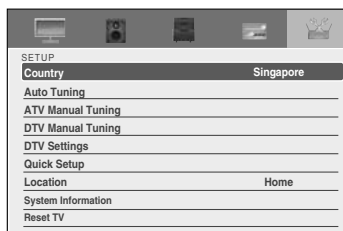

Watching TV programmes

Selecting the country

You can select a country. If the **Country** setting is changed, the **Quick Setup** starts again.

- 1 Press **MENU**, then press \triangleleft or \triangleright to display **SETUP** menu.
- 2 Press ∇ or \triangle to select **Country** and press **OK**.



Quick Setup confirmation screen will appear.

- 3 Press \triangleleft or \triangleright to select **Yes**, and press **OK**.
- 4 Press ∇ , \triangle , \triangleleft or \triangleright to select the desired country.

Once the **Country** has been selected, you will proceed to the **Primary Subtitle Language**, **Secondary Subtitle Language**, **Primary Audio Language** and **Secondary Audio Language** settings, and then to the **Auto Tuning** settings. (page 12).

NOTE:

Depending on the broadcast environment, this TV may not be able to receive certain broadcasting in whole or in part. Any guarantee of reception of broadcasting is hereby disclaimed.

When this TV cannot receive digital broadcasting, please select the ATV (analogue channel) as the Tuning Mode.

For region where digital broadcasting is not available or cannot be received because of the difference in broadcasting system, please use the ATV (analogue channel) as the Tuning Mode.

Changing the position

Enter the desired position number using the **Number** buttons on the remote control.

You can also change the position by using **P▲** or **P▼**. The position will be displayed on the screen.

NOTE:

Changing positions between different format channels takes several seconds.

Displaying the on-screen information

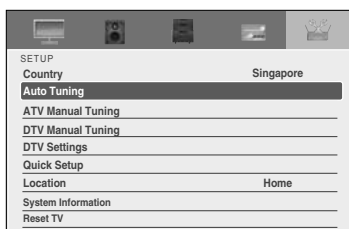
To display on-screen information such as channel, input mode or stereo/mono signal, press **(i+)**. Press again to cancel.

Programming channels into the TV's channel memory

If the broadcast information has changed in your Digital Broadcasting receiving area, the TV detects the changes and add the new channels automatically if updated. If you do not wish for the TV to detect changes and prompt you to rescan, you should set this feature to "Off".

- 1 From the **Equaliser** menu, press ∇ or \triangle to select **Power Sound Equaliser**.

Surround help to create rich and wider sound from stereo sound sources.

Using the Power Bass Booster

Power Bass Booster helps to create rich bass.

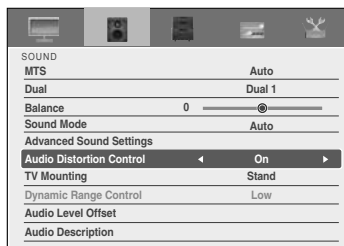

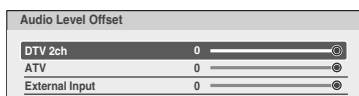

Sometimes there can be large changes in volume when switching from a DTV 5.1ch to a DTV 2ch, an ATV channel, or an external input. Using the **Audio Level Offset** feature reduces these volume differences.

- 1 Set the volume level usually used when watching a DTV 5.1ch programme.
- 2 Tune to a channel which is DTV 2ch, ATV or an external input.

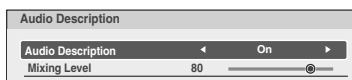

Audio Description

Audio Description is an additional narrative sound track for visually impaired individuals to understand and enjoy the story line more fully. The letters AD will be displayed in the channel banner when programmes contain AD content.

- 1 From the **SOUND** menu, press ∇ or Δ to select **Audio Description** and press **OK**.

- 2 Press ∇ or Δ to select **Audio Description** and press \triangleleft or \triangleright to select **On**.



- 3 To adjust the level of the audio description sound to the main sound, select **Mixing Level** and press \triangleleft or \triangleright .

NOTE:

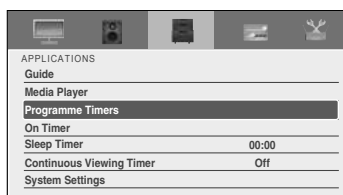
This may be unavailable depending on the conditions.

Other features settings

Programme Timers – digital only

This feature will set the television to go to a specific channel at a certain time. It can be used to view a particular programme, or by setting the mode to daily or weekly, can be used to view a series of programmes.

- 1 From the **APPLICATIONS** menu, press ∇ or Δ to select **Programme Timers**, and press **OK**.

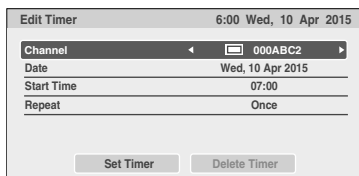


The list of **Programme Timers** appear on screen.

- 2 Select an empty line, and press **OK**.

The **Edit timer** menu appear on screen.

- Press ∇ or Δ to go through the list adding the details of the programme by using the number buttons and \triangleleft or \triangleright to make selections.



- When all of the details have been entered, select **Set Timer** and press **OK** to save the timer.

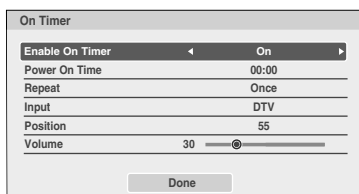
PLEASE NOTE:

When a timed programme is about to start, an information screen will appear offering the option of watching or cancelling the programme. It will only be possible to create or edit programme timers for the currently tuned DTV input.

Setting the On Timer menu

The feature allows you to set the TV to turn on automatically to a preset position or input.

- From the **APPLICATIONS** menu, press ∇ or Δ to select **On Timer**, and then press **OK**.
- Press ∇ or Δ to select **Enable On Timer**, and then press \triangleleft or \triangleright to select **On**.



- Press ∇ or Δ to go through the list adding the details of the On Timer by using the **Number** buttons and \triangleleft or \triangleright to make selections and press **OK**.

Power On Time: Set the time you prefer with the number buttons.

Repeat: Select the desired On Timer operation (**Once, Every Day, Mon- Fri, Mon-Sat, Sat-Sun**).

Input: Select a video input source (**ATV, DTV, EXT 1, EXT 2, HDMI 1, HDMI 2, HDMI 3 or PC**).

Position: Set the position that will be tuned when the TV turns on.

Volume: Select the volume level that will be set when the TV turns on.

- When all the details have been entered, select **Done** and press **OK** to start the timer.

To cancel the On Timer

- From the **On Timer** menu, press ∇ or Δ to select **Enable On Timer**.
- Press \triangleleft or \triangleright to select **Off**, and then select **Done** and press **OK**.

NOTE:

The TV will automatically turn itself off after approximately 2 hours if you do not operate the TV after turned on by on timer function.

Setting the Sleep Timer

The Sleep Timer is especially useful if you want the TV to turn itself off after a selected period of time.

- From the **APPLICATIONS** menu, press ∇ or Δ to select **Sleep Timer**.
- Press the **Number** buttons (0-9) to enter the amount of time until the TV turns off. Alternatively, press \triangleleft or \triangleright to adjust the time in blocks of 10 minutes up to 12 hours.
- Press **EXIT** to start the timer.

To cancel the **Sleep Timer**, enter all zeros for the step 2.

Using the Continuous Viewing Timer

To prevent watching TV continuously for long periods of time, you can set a message to appear that suggests that the viewer takes a break. This is especially useful for stopping children from watching TV for long periods of time.

- From the **APPLICATIONS** menu, press ∇ or Δ to select **Continuous Viewing Timer**.
- Press \triangleleft or \triangleright to select **60 min, 120 min, 180 min or Off**.

When the set time has passed, a message suggesting the viewer takes a break appears.

Press **OK, BACK** or **EXIT** to clear the message.

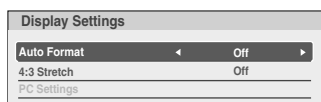
NOTE:

- If the power is turned off before the set amount of time has passed, the timer is reset.
- If the set amount of time is changed, the timer is reset.

Using the Auto Format

When **Auto Format** is **On** and the TV receives a digital broadcast or a true HDMI signal picture, it will automatically be displayed in the appropriate format according to the signal information, irrespective of the TV's settings.

- 1 From the **Display Settings** in the **PREFERENCES** menu, press ∇ or \triangle to select **Auto Format**.



- 2 Press \triangleleft or \triangleright to select **On** or **Off**.

Activating the 4:3 Stretch

When 4:3 stretch is activated, this function will switch 4:3 format programmes into a full screen picture.

- 1 From the **Display Settings** menu, press ∇ or \triangle to select **4:3 Stretch**.
- 2 Press \triangleleft or \triangleright to select **On** or **Off**.

NOTE:

*This feature is not available when **Auto Format** is set to **Off**.*

Activating Blue Screen

When **Blue Screen** is set to **On**, the screen will turn blue and the sound will be muted when no signal is received.

- 1 From the **PREFERENCES** menu, press ∇ or \triangle until **Blue Screen** is selected.
- 2 Press \triangleleft or \triangleright to select **On** or **Off**.

NOTE:

Some external inputs may not mute the sound.

Eco Mode

*In **Eco Mode**, the screen becomes slightly darker and you will be able to reduce power consumption.*

NOTE:

*The Backlight adjustment is not available in **Eco Mode**.*

- 1 From the **PREFERENCES** menu, press ∇ or \triangle until **Energy Saving Settings** is selected, and then press **OK**.
- 2 Press ∇ or \triangle to select **Eco Mode** and press \triangleleft or \triangleright to select **On** or **Off**.

Setting No Signal Power Down

The TV will automatically turn itself off after 15 minutes when no signal is detected. You can change the setting to **Off** for the following purposes:

- Low signal strength of analog channel (no signal detection).
- Only Audio L/R is connected to an external input in order to listen to music through the TV speakers.

- 1 From the **PREFERENCES** menu, press ∇ or \triangle until **Energy Saving Settings** is selected, and then press **OK**.
- 2 Press ∇ or \triangle to select **No Signal Power Down**, and then press **OK**.
- 3 Press ∇ or \triangle to select the item you want to change and press \triangleleft or \triangleright to select **On** or **Off**.

NOTE:

- *Default setting is all **On**.*
- *A warning message will appear 1 minute before turning off.*

Setting the Power Saving Indicator

You can display the current power saving status.

- 1 From the **PREFERENCES** menu, press ∇ or \triangle until **Energy Saving Settings** is selected, and then press **OK**.
- 2 Press ∇ or \triangle to select **Power Saving Indicator** and press \triangleleft or \triangleright to select **On** or **Off**.

Press **(i+)** when the **Power Saving Indicator** is **On** to display the **Saving Level**.

- The longer the **Saving Level** display bar is, the higher the power save effect is.
- The saving level is also displayed when the **Picture Mode** or **Backlight** settings are changed.

Digital on-screen information and Programme Guide

When viewing in **digital** mode, the on-screen information and programme guide provide access to programme details for all available channels.

Information

- 1 Press **[I+]**, the information screen will appear giving details of the channel and programme currently being viewed.

Display Example



- 2 Press **▽** or **△** to select the "Now" or "Next" information guide.

To display More Information

- 1 Press **QUICK** to open the **Quick Menu**.
- 2 Press **▽** or **△** to select **More Information** and press **OK**.

This may take a few moments to appear.

Channels are displayed in groups by service type (TV, Radio, Text). Pressing the **TV** button will switch the service type.

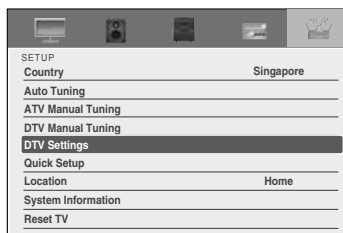

- Select a programme that will be broadcast later and press **OK** to open the **Edit Timer** menu .

Digital settings – parental control

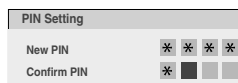
In order to prevent viewing of unsuitable films and programmes, channels and menus can be locked in digital mode. These can then only be accessed with a security code PIN.

Parental PIN Setup

- 1 From the **SETUP** menu, press ▽ or △ to select **DTV Settings** and press **OK**.



- 2 Press ▽ and △ to select **PIN Setting** and press **OK**.
- 3 Using the number buttons enter a four digit number.
Once entered you will be prompted to confirm by entering again.



The PIN number is now set.

If the PIN code has been set, when **Country**, **Auto Tuning**, **Quick Setup**, **Parental Control**, and **Reset TV** are executed, entering the PIN will be necessary. "0000" is not acceptable.

To change or delete your PIN code:

- 1 In the **DTV Settings** menu, press ▽ or △ to select **PIN Setting** menu and press **OK**.
- 2 Press the Number buttons to enter your four digit PIN code.
- 3 Select **Change PIN** or **Delete PIN** and press **OK**.

Parental Control

The Parental Control feature allows you to block programmes according to their rating levels. If a PIN has been set, you will need to enter it before adjusting the level.

- 1 From the **DTV Settings** menu, press ∇ or Δ to select **Parental Control** and press **OK**.
- 2 Use the number buttons to enter your four digit number.
- 3 Press \triangleleft or \triangleright to adjust the setting.
 - The setting values will differ depending on the country selected for **Country**.

To view blocked programmes, enter the PIN. To reactivate the Parental Control, turn the TV off and then on again.

Digital settings – Channel Options

Selecting favourite channels

Favourite Channels creates a list of the digital channels that are watched most. Four lists can be created, they can be a mixture of television, radio and text channels.

- 1 Select a channel you want to add to your favourite list.
- 2 Press **QUICK** to open the **Quick Menu**.
- 3 Press ∇ or Δ to select **Channel Options** and press **OK**.
- 4 Press \triangleleft or \triangleright repeatedly to select the favourite list (☆).
- 5 Press **OK** to select the ones required. A tick will appear in the box as they are selected.
- 6 Repeat steps 1 through 5 for other channels.
- 7 When all favourites have been selected, press **EXIT**.

Favourite Channel Lists

- 1 Press **LIST** to display **Channel List**.
- 2 Press \triangleleft or \triangleright to select Favourite Channels. The number of favourites available depends on how many lists have been created.



- 3 Press ∇ or Δ to select a channel and press **OK** to watch.

Skip channels

This feature allows you to set channels that will be skipped when **P ∇** or **P \wedge** are used to tune.

- 1 Select the channel you want to skip in your channel list.
- 2 From the **Quick Menu**, press ∇ or Δ to select **Channel Options** and press **OK**.
- 3 Press \triangleleft or \triangleright repeatedly to highlight the skip (👁) box.
- 4 Press **OK** to select. A tick will appear in the box.
- 5 Repeat steps 1 through 4 for other channels.
- 6 Press **EXIT**.

NOTE:

*Skipped channels cannot be selected by **P ∇** or **P \wedge** but still be accessed by direct number entry (when tuned a 👁 icon will be displayed in the banner to indicate as a skipped channel).*

Locking channels

Locking Channels stops the viewing of digital channels, and they can only be accessed by entering the PIN.

- A PIN must be set beforehand in PIN Setting (🔒 page 30).

- 1 Select the channel you want to lock in your channel list.
- 2 From the **Quick Menu**, press ∇ or Δ to select **Channel Options** and press **OK**.
- 3 Press \triangleleft or \triangleright repeatedly to select the lock (🔒) box.
- 4 Press **OK** to select. A tick will appear in the box.
If a PIN has already been set, PIN entry will be required to set the locked channels.
- 5 Repeat steps 1 through 4 for other channels.
- 6 Press **EXIT**.
- 7 From this point on, when any of the channels in the Locked Channel list are selected, the PIN must be entered before they can be accessed.

Digital settings – other settings

Subtitles

In digital mode, this feature will show subtitles on the screen in the selected language provided they are being broadcast.

- 1 From the **DTV Settings** menu, press ∇ or \triangle to select **Subtitle and Audio** and press **OK**.
- 2 Press ∇ or \triangle to select **Subtitle Display** and use \triangleleft or \triangleright to select **On** or **Off**.

- 3 Press ∇ or \triangle to select **Subtitle Type** and press \triangleleft or \triangleright to select **Normal** or **For Hard of Hearing**.
- 4 Press ∇ or \triangle to select **Primary Subtitle Language** or **Secondary Subtitle Language** and press \triangleleft or \triangleright to select an option.

The **SUBTITLE** button can be used to select subtitle on or off for the current channel only and to select the subtitle language if more than one subtitle is available.

Audio languages

This feature allows a programme or film to be viewed with a choice of sound track language, provided multiple language tracks are being broadcast.

- 1 From the **Subtitle and Audio** menu, press ∇ or \triangle to select **Primary Audio Language** or **Secondary Audio Language** and press \triangleleft or \triangleright to select an option.
If more than one sound track is available, use the \odot / \square button to select between them.

Postal Code

This is displayed only when **Country** is set to **Indonesia**.

- 1 From the **DTV Settings** menu, press ∇ or \triangle to select **Postal Code** and press **OK**.
- 2 Use the **Number** buttons to enter your postal code.

Local Time Setting

The clock that is displayed while watching the TV can be set to display time information acquired via the internet or time information acquired via a digital broadcasting signal.

- When purchased, the TV displays time information acquired via the internet.

- 1 From the **DTV Settings** menu, press ∇ or \triangle to select **Local Time Setting** and press **OK**.
- 2 Press ∇ or \triangle to select **Enable DTV Clock** and use \triangleleft or \triangleright to select **On**.

This changes the time displayed when watching the TV to the time received via the digital broadcasting signal. The time received by the DTV Clock is displayed.

If the time needs to be adjusted according to the area in which you live, perform the following procedure.

- 3 Press ∇ or \triangle to select **Offset** and use \triangleleft or \triangleright to adjust the time.

The time can be adjusted in 30 minute increments. The adjusted time is displayed in Display Clock.

NOTE:

*When **Enable DTV Clock** is set to **On**, the time that is displayed on the information screen, the Guide screen and other screens when watching the TV is the time received via the digital broadcasting signal. All timers operate according to time information acquired via the internet.*

Signal Booster

Set the DTV **Signal Booster**.

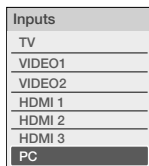
- 1 From the **DTV Settings** menu, press ∇ or \triangle to select **Signal Booster** and press **OK**.
The **Signal Booster** screen appears, and the signal strength of each channel is displayed in a bar.
- 2 Press ∇ or \triangle to select a channel to set the **Signal Booster** for.
- 3 Press **RED** button.

Switch between **On** and **Off** for the **Signal Booster** setting for the selected channel.

Repeat steps 2 and 3 to set **Signal Booster** for each channel.

Selecting the video input source to view

- 1 Press \odot on the remote control until the video input mode list appears on the screen, then press ∇ , \triangle or \odot to select appropriate input source (or touch \odot / \odot and \wedge or \vee on the TV left side panel to select required input source directly).



- 2 Press **OK**.

VIDEO1 (\odot (1), COMPONENT/VIDEO INPUT, standard or component video input), VIDEO2 (\odot (2), standard video input), HDMI1, HDMI2 HDMI 3 (HDMI input), PC (\odot RGB/PC, PC input)

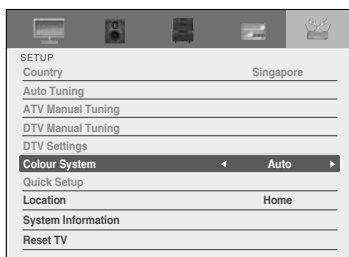
NOTE:

If the **Inputs** list is displayed by pressing \odot / \odot and \wedge or \vee on the left side of the TV and \wedge or \vee , the options are DTV / VIDEO (1, 2) / HDMI (1, 2, 3) / PC / ATV.

Setting the Colour System

This feature is available in Standard video (composite) inputs mode.

- 1 Press **MENU**, and then press \triangleleft or \triangleright to display the **SETUP** menu.



- 2 Press ∇ or \triangle to select **Colour System**, and then press \triangleleft or \triangleright to select **Auto**, **PAL**, **SECAM**, **NTSC 4.43** or **NTSC 3.58**.

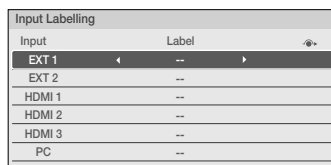

Confirm that **Colour System** is set to "Auto". If not, select "Auto" with \triangleleft or \triangleright .

Labelling video input sources

These input labels are shown in the input selector. You can label external inputs according to the devices you have connected to the TV.

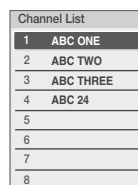
- 1 From the **PREFERENCES** menu, press \triangle or ∇ to select **AV Connection** and press **OK**.
- 2 Press ∇ or \triangle to select **Input Labelling** and press **OK**.



- 3 Press ∇ or \triangle to select the item you want to label and press \triangleleft or \triangleright to select --, **Amplifier**, **Cable**, **DVD**, **Game**, **PC**, **Recorder**, **Satellite** or **VCR**, or press the **RED** button to turn on the skip.
- 4 Repeat step 3 for other video inputs.

Channel List (for ATV)

- 1 Press **LIST**. The Channel List will appear.



- 2 Press ∇ or \triangle to select a channel, and then press **OK**.

Confirming software version

For ATV

- 1 From the **SETUP** menu, press ∇ or \triangle to select **System Information**.
- 2 Press **OK** to display the software version.

NOTE:

The software version displayed is just for the illustration.

For DTV

This feature can be used to check the version of software currently installed. When in DTV mode, it includes additional diagnostic information such as signal strength, signal quality, centre frequency, modulation, etc

- 1 From the **SETUP** menu, press ∇ or \triangle to select **System Information**.
- 2 Press **OK** to display the Boot Code Version and APP SW Version.

- 3 For information about the signal quality of a particular multiplex, press ∇ or \triangle to select that multiplex.
- 4 Press **OK** for a screen showing detailed technical information about the selected multiplex.

Over-the-air Upgrade

The Over-the-air Upgrade function is used when a Software Upgrade is required for the TV in the future.

NOTE:

- This function may not work depending on the country selected for **Country**.
- The Over-the-air Upgrade may not function correctly depending on the local area broadcasting conditions, and the signal receiving environment.

Auto Upgrade

When **Auto Upgrade** is **On**, the television automatically searches for upgrade information. When new upgrade information is found, a confirmation screen is displayed.

- Automatic searching is not performed when the television is in standby.

- 1 From the **SETUP** menu, press ∇ or \triangle to select **DTV Settings** and press **OK**.
- 2 Press ∇ or \triangle to select **Over-the-air Upgrade** menu and press **OK**.

- 3 Press ∇ or \triangle to select **Auto Upgrade**.

- 4 Press \triangleleft or \triangleright to select **On** or **Off**.

Searching for New Software

If preferred, software upgrades can be searched for manually using Search for New Software.

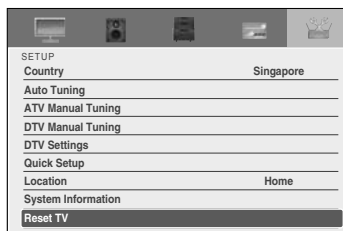
- 1 From the **SETUP** menu, press ∇ or \triangle to select **DTV Settings** and press **OK**.
- 2 Press ∇ or \triangle to select **Over-the-air Upgrade** menu and press **OK**.
- 3 Press ∇ or \triangle to select **Auto Upgrade** and press \triangleleft or \triangleright to select **On**.
- 4 Press ∇ or \triangle to select **Search for New Software**.
- 5 Press **OK**. The television will automatically start searching for a software upgrade, the progress bar will move along the line.

If an upgrade is found, a message will be displayed on the television. Follow the instructions in the message. If no upgrades are found, a screen will appear stating that no upgrades are available.

Resetting the TV

Reset TV will reset all TV settings, including stored channels, to their original factory values.

- 1 From the **SETUP** menu, press ∇ or \triangle to select **Reset TV**.



- 2 Press **OK** to select.

A screen will appear warning that all settings will be lost. Select **Yes**, and then press **OK** to continue.

Teletext

This TV has a multi-page Teletext memory, which takes a few moments to load and it offers two ways of viewing Teletext **Auto** and **List** which are explained below.

Setting up the Teletext mode

To select a language for Teletext:

The language 1-4 option enables the display of different language when using Teletext.

- 1 From the **PREFERENCES** menu, and then press ∇ or \triangle to select **Teletext Language**.
- 2 Press \triangleleft or \triangleright to select the required language.
 - **Language 1:** English, German, Dutch, Flemish, Russian, Bulgarian, Ukrainian, Lettish, Lithuanian, Czech, Slovak, Estonian
 - **Language 2:** Polish, German, Dutch, Flemish, Estonian, Lettish, Lithuanian, French, Serbian, Croatian, Slovenian, Czech, Slovak, Rumanian
 - **Language 3:** English, French, Hebrew, Turkish, Arabic
 - **Language 4:** English, French, Hebrew, Turkish, Farsi (Iranian/Persian)

To select Teletext mode:

Select a channel position with the desired Teletext service.

- 1 From **PREFERENCES** menu, press ∇ or \triangle to select **Teletext**.
- 2 Press \triangleleft or \triangleright to select **Auto** or **List** mode.

NOTE:

- It may take a few moments for the multi-page teletext memory to load.
- You must exit teletext mode in order to display the main menu.

Teletext general information

TEXT button:

Pressing **TEXT** once will bring up the teletext screen. Press again to return to normal TV mode. You need to return to normal viewing if you wish to change channels.

When you first press **TEXT** to access the text service, the first page you see will be the initial page. In **Auto** mode, this displays the main subjects available and their relevant page numbers. In **List** mode, you will see the page numbers currently stored on the **each colour** button.

Sub-pages:

Once in this chosen page, if there are sub-pages they will automatically load into memory without changing the one you are reading. If there are many sub-pages, it will take a long time for them all to load and this will depend on the speed with which the broadcaster transmits them.

To access the sub-pages in memory, press \triangleleft or \triangleright to view them.

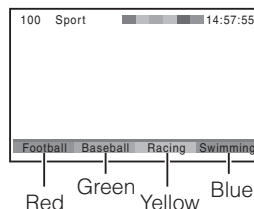
Using Subtitles

- 1 Press **SUBTITLE** on the remote control to while the teletext screen is displayed to display subtitles. While the subtitles are displayed, press **SUBTITLE** again to change the setting.

Using Auto mode

There are two Modes: **Auto** will display FASTEXT, if available. **List** will display your four favorite pages. In either mode, as an alternative to the coloured buttons, you can access a page by entering a 3-digit number, using the **Number** buttons on the remote control, or to advance to the next page, press **P \wedge** , to go back to the previous page press **P \vee** . To change between **Auto** and **List**, see above.

- Press **TEXT** to access teletext.

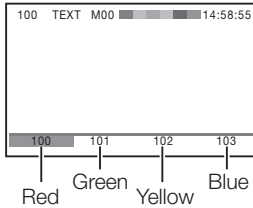


If FASTEXT is available, you will see 4 coloured titles at the base of the TV screen. To access any given subject, simply press the relevant coloured button on the remote control.

If FASTEXT is not available, you can access any page simply by entering a 3-digit page number or pressing the corresponding coloured button. For further information on your particular text system(s), see the broadcast teletext index page or consult your local TOSHIBA dealer.

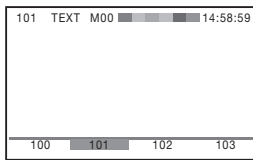
Using List mode

- 1 Press **TEXT** to access teletext.



The four choices at the bottom of the screen are now number – **100, 101, 102** and **103**, which have been programmed into the TV's memory.

- 2 To view these pages, use the coloured prompt buttons.
e.g. press the Green button to view page 101.
- 3 If you want to change these stored pages, press the coloured button for the colour you want to change.
e.g. Press the Green button and enter the 3-digit number.



This number will change.

- 4 Press **OK** to store your choice.
- 5 You may view other pages by simply entering the 3-digit page number – but **NEVER** press **OK** or you will lose the favorite already stored.

Teletext buttons on the remote control

Below is an introduction to the teletext buttons on your remote control and their functions.

TEXT To display a page of teletext:

Press **TEXT** to display teletext. Press again to return to normal TV mode.

Index To display an index/initial page:

In Auto-mode

Press **Index** to access the index page. The one displayed is dependant on the broadcaster.

In List-mode

Press **Index** to return to the 100 page or initial page.

Text To reveal concealed text:

Some pages cover topics such as quizzes and jokes. To discover the solutions, press **Text**.

Text To hold a wanted page:

This function is included as it is part of the broadcast teletext system but you will not need it as this TV allows you to control the display of sub-pages.

Text To enlarge the teletext display size:

Press **Text** once to enlarge the top half of the page, press again to enlarge the bottom half of the page. Press again to revert to the normal size.

Text To select a page while viewing a normal picture:

When in teletext mode, if a page selection is made and then **Text** is pressed, a normal picture will be displayed. The TV will indicate when the page is present by displaying the title bar of the text page at the top of the screen. Press **Text** to view the page.

NOTE:

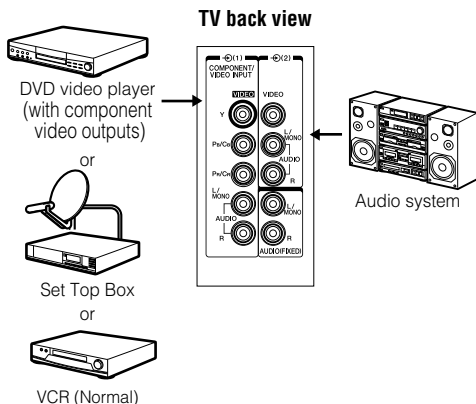

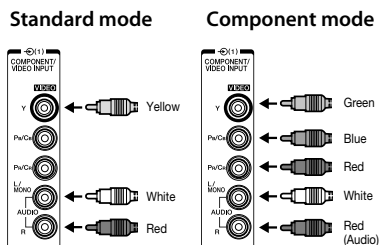

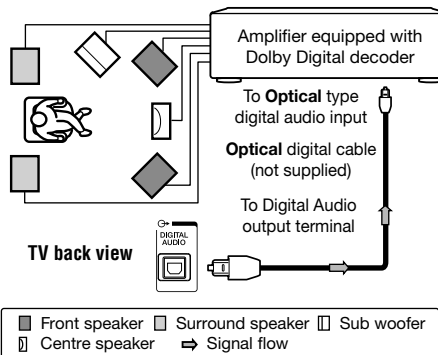

- When you connect the TV to other equipment, be sure to turn off the power and unplug all of the equipment from the wall outlet before making any connections.

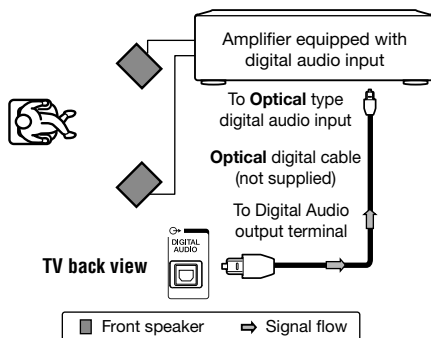

Connecting an amplifier equipped with a Dolby Digital decoder



You can enjoy dynamic realistic sound by connecting the TV to an amplifier equipped with a Dolby Digital decoder or Dolby Digital processor. When using this setup, select **Auto** in the **Digital Audio Output** (☞ page 49).

Connecting an amplifier equipped with a digital audio (optical) input



You can enjoy the dynamic sound of a 2-channel digital stereo by connecting the TV to an amplifier equipped with a digital audio (optical) input and speaker system (right and left front speakers). When using this setup, select **PCM** in the **Digital Audio Output** (page 49).

Connecting HDMI or DVI devices

Using the PC Settings

- First press until the video input mode list appears on the screen, then press or and **OK** in order to select the PC input mode (see page 33).
- This function may not be available for some signal or if no signal is received.

Adjusting the picture position

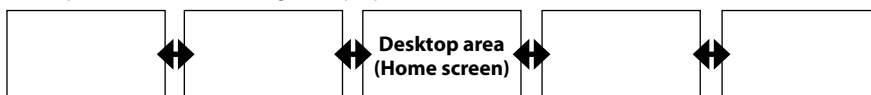

 - When purchased, icons such as the TOSHIBA Information and Browser icon are located on the desktop area of the home screen. The desktop areas can be customized.
- 4 Screen slide button**
You move to the desktop area to the left or right. The home screen is located at the centre, and the desktop areas to the left and right are prepared.

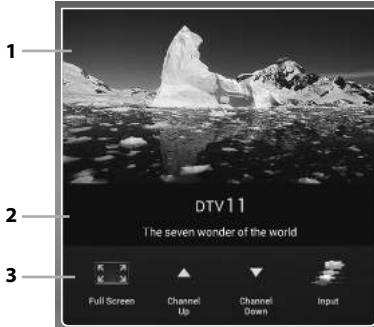


- 5 Dock bar area**
Shortcut icons for frequently used applications can be found here.
When purchased, you can find the Google folder, Drawer icon and Settings icon here.
 - Up to 7 shortcuts can be placed in the dock bar area.
- 6 User Name area**

- 7 Navigation area**
This area contains basic navigation icons.



The desktop area of the home screen

The TV window and fixed icons are located on the desktop area of the home screen.




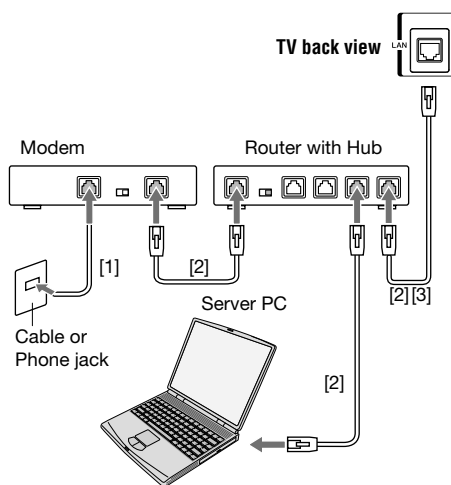

Sound

Configure volume and other settings.

To display the sound setup screen, select Sound and then press the pointing key.

HDMI CEC Control input source selection

If an HDMI CEC Control device with HDMI switching capability (e.g. AV amplifier) is connected to the HDMI input, you can select another HDMI CEC Control device that is connected to the master HDMI device on the input source list.

- 1 Press  and a list will appear on screen showing available input sources.
- 2 Press  or  to select the input source that the HDMI CEC Control devices are connected.
- 3 Press  and a second selection screen will appear showing all connected HDMI CEC Control equipment.



- 4 Press  or  to select the desired input source, and then press **OK**.

NOTE:

- These functions depend on the device connected. If you select the HDMI CEC Control input source from the popup window, some HDMI CEC Control devices may automatically turn on.
- If you change the HDMI device connection or the HDMI device settings, the HDMI CEC settings may change.



Troubleshooting

Before calling a service technician, please check the following table for a possible cause of the symptom and some solutions.

Symptom and solution



TV will not turn on

- Make sure the power cord is plugged in, and then press .
- The remote control batteries may be dead. Replace the batteries.

No picture, no sound

- Check the aerial connections.

No sound, picture OK

- The sound may be muted. Press  +, - or .
- The station may have broadcast difficulties. Try another channel.

Poor sound, picture OK

- The station may have broadcast difficulties. Try another channel.

Poor picture, sound OK

- Check the aerial connections.
- The station may have broadcast difficulties. Try another channel.
- Adjust the **PICTURE** menu.

Poor reception of broadcast channels

- Check the aerial connections.
- The station may have broadcast difficulties. Try another channel.
- Make sure the **Colour System** is properly set.

Teletext problems

- Check the aerial connections.
- Good performance of text depends on a good strong broadcast signal.

Some pixels of the screen do not light up

- The LCD display panel is manufactured using an extremely high level of precision technology, however, sometimes some pixels of the screen may be missing picture elements or have luminous spots. This is not a sign of a malfunction.

The picture brightness varies when you switch the TV on.

- If you switch the TV on at 0°C or under, it takes some time for the TV to warm up.

Multiple images

- The station may have broadcast difficulties. Try another channel.
- Aerial reception may be poor. Use a high directional outdoor aerial.
- Check if the direction of the aerial has been changed.

Poor colour or no colour

- The station may have broadcast difficulties. Try another channel.
- Adjust the **Tint** and/or **Colour** in the **PICTURE** menu.

The remote control does not operate

- Remove all obstructions between the remote control and the remote control sensor on the TV.
- The remote control batteries may be dead. Replace the batteries.

If the PIN code has been forgotten:

- Use the Master PIN (code of 1276), then change to a number of your choice. Ensure that no-one else can use the Master PIN by removing the Owner's Manual.
